THE FEAST OF MORTA WITH THE COMMUNITY OF CARITAS An Alternative to Halloween

We invite you to join us in a celebration a Friend of Medjugorje created in 1996 to contradict Halloween. Instead of wickedness and darkness, he began a night for our hearts to be purified and bring joy to our loved ones who have passed on to the next life. It has been over 25 years since the tradition began and it has even spread to other countries.

We meet in our John Jacob’s Cemetery at Caritas. Gathering around a fire, we remembered our special loved ones who had passed on from this life in prayers asking Our Lady to give them each a kiss from us in Heaven, and if they were in purgatory, that these prayers would comfort them and hurry their release. Our Lady of Medjugorje said that “the souls in Purgatory can see their loved ones during those moments when you pray for them by name.” A joy for them!

The culmination of our prayers is the Rosary that follows the naming of our beloved dead. A dead leaf is picked off the ground by each person and held onto for a time of reflection and prayer. Each person then goes to the fire during the Rosary to toss it in the flames after naming everything in our hearts we want purified out of us. The burning of the leaf represents our purification.

After the Rosary, we will walk down to the Field to pray before nearly 100 incredible relics, with Vatican papers. A Friend of Medjugorje was first given an extraordinary relic (with Vatican papers) of St. Ann, mother of the Virgin Mary, hence the Grandmother of Jesus. You will be awestruck throughout the evening. It will be a Feast of Morta you will not forget, but you will begin the tradition yourself.

Feast of Morta will begin around 4:30 p.m. meet in the Caritas Parking Lot. There will not be tricks, but we will have homemade treats. We invite you to bring some type of dessert with you made with love to add to the treats! Make sure that you bring a blanket to sit on.
